The facility management team wanted to add vitality, visual impact and freshness to the three-story interior atrium. The contractor responded with a design that adds human scale and excitement - in an environment with limited light.

Reducing the vertical scale of the space, replica 16-foot black olives are underplanted with live bromeliads.

Artificial prairie grass and needlepoint ivy swirls blended in with live bromeliads, *Philodendron* 'Moonlight,' *Dracaena Warneckii* 'Lemon Lime' and ZZ plants add color and interest to the focal-point water feature and street entrances.
