This year's winning interiorscape contractors, designers and suppliers exemplify creative ingenuity in answering the interests and needs of their clients.

In Hammond, IN, Harrah's Entertainment asked for the "wow factor" to impress guests at its new Horseshoe Casino. The answer: three giant multicolored koi sculptures, covered in thousands of replica flowers, that "swim" about 15 feet above the floor.

In Austin, Silicon Laboratories requested a whimsical design to reflect the company's dedication to mixing fun with business. The answer: a Southwestern-inspired combination of driftwood, assorted tropicals and succulents in the building's wall planters.

In Boston, 99 Summer Street's lobby redesign called for a polished, architectural design - installed in planters from 6 inches to 20 feet once used in a water feature. The answer: a complementary combination of replica and silk selections in hard-to-reach areas and live plants in accessible planters.

This 100,000-square-foot space features a central series of planters totaling 24'x160' in each of its two wings. The client requested separate concepts for each of the planters: an "Asian Garden" theme and a "North Woods" theme.

In the Asian Garden, a dry stream bed filled with Mexican beach pebbles weaves through replica pink and white flowering dogwoods, black olives and bamboo, ending in a 50'x20' koi pond. The planter incorporates live Glauca, Sansevieria, bromeliads, peace lilies and ZZ plants.

In the North Woods planter, replica over-story trees include paper birch, scotch pine and Rocky Mountain pine. Replica autumn prairie grass, hostas and forest ferns add interest at the ground level. Live plants include mahogany, peace lilies, Glauca, pothos, liriopé and bromeliads.



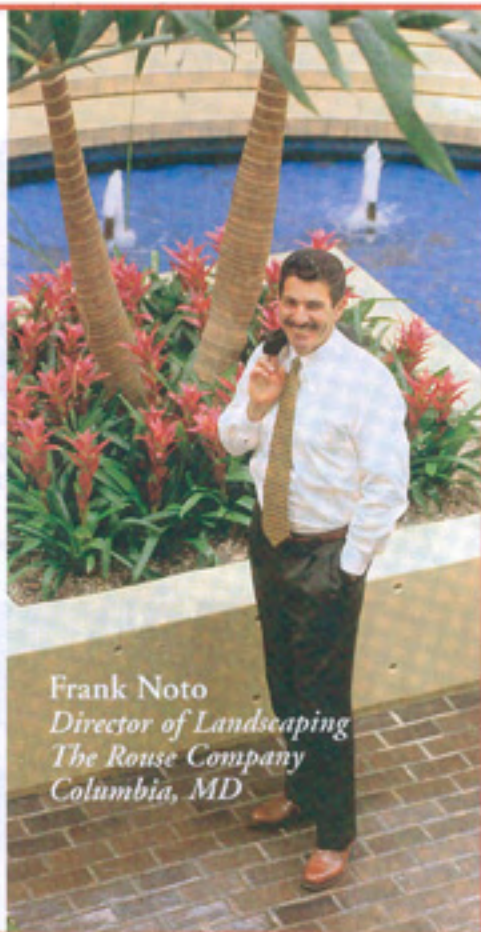
